

Symptoms

Mpox often leads to a combination of symptoms, including:

- › Fever or chills
- › Headache
- › Exhaustion
- › Back pain and muscle ache
- › Skin rash or blisters

Complications:

Most people who get mpox recover without any complications, but those with severe symptoms may need to be hospitalised.



Talk to your doctor for general advice and about eligibility for vaccination against mpox.

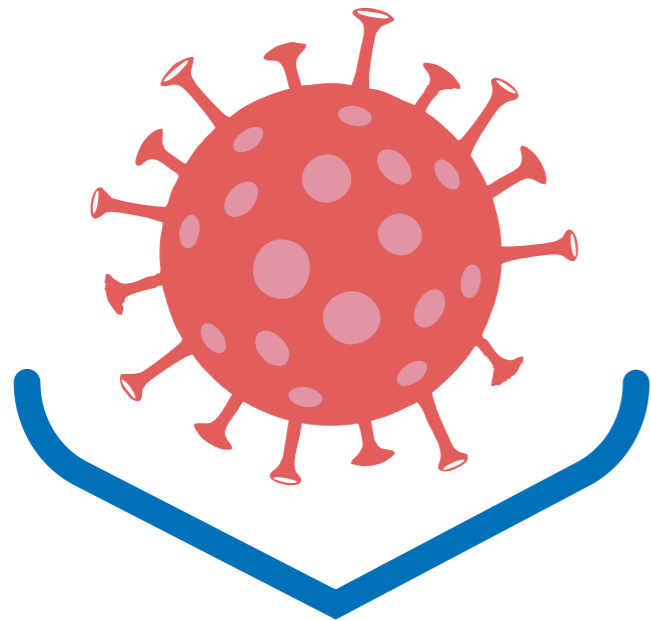

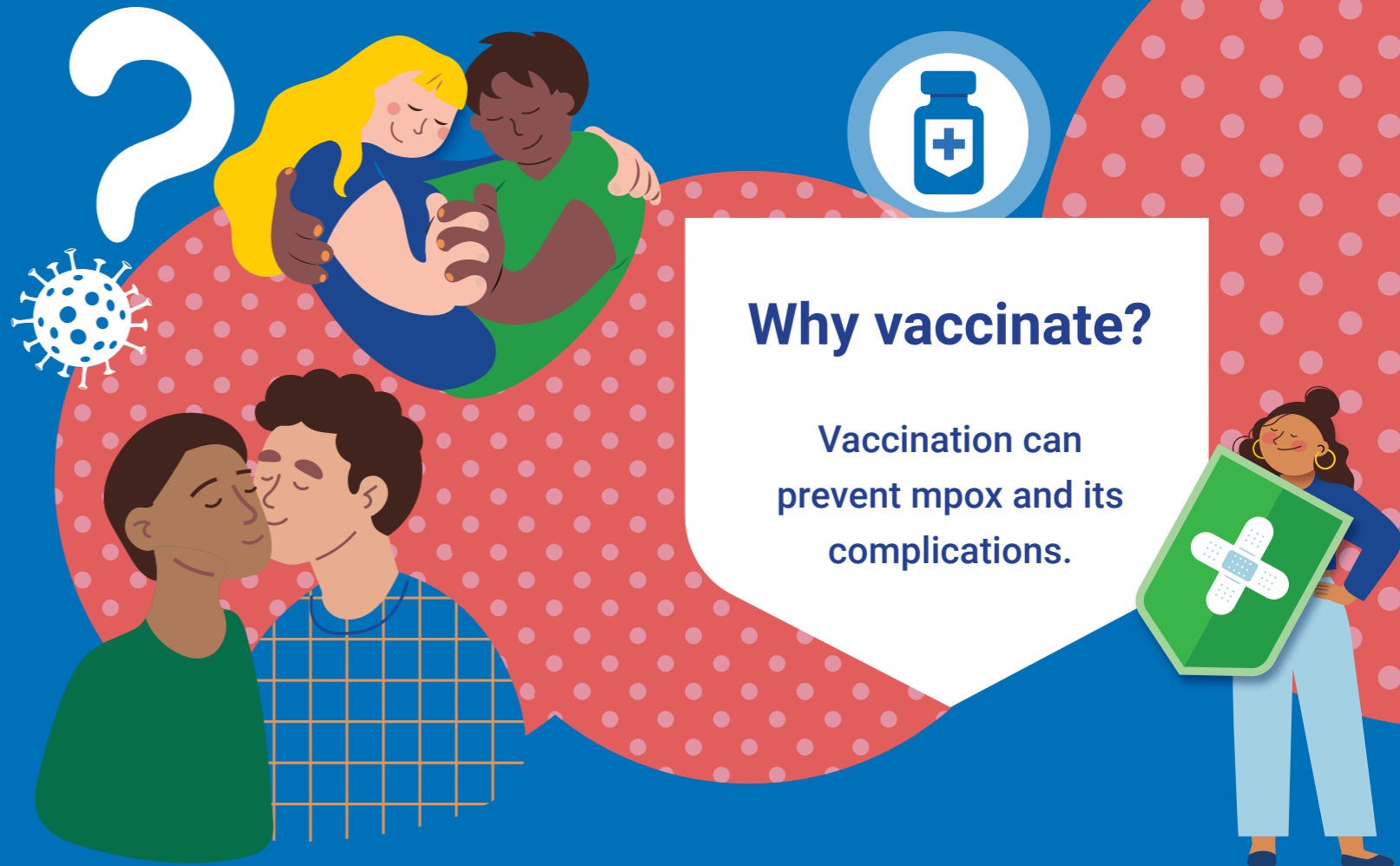


Mpox (monkeypox)

Mpox is a viral infection that causes skin blisters, fever, headache and muscle pains. The virus spreads through close, direct contact (including sexual contact) with an infected person, but it can be prevented by vaccination.

Who's at risk?

- › Anyone who has close, direct contact (including sexual contact) with someone who has mpox.
- › People with weakened immune systems may be more at risk from mpox and its complications.



Why vaccinate?

Vaccination can prevent mpox and its complications.
